Winners Announced for the 36th Annual Oklahoma Book Awards

OKLAHOMA CITY, OK – The Oklahoma Department of Libraries (ODL) is pleased to announce the winners of the 36th Annual Oklahoma Book Awards, which were revealed during a special ceremony held Friday, May 16 at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City.

The Oklahoma Book Awards celebrate outstanding contributions by authors, illustrators, photographers, designers, and publishers whose work is either created by Oklahomans, centers on the state, or explores Oklahoma-related themes. The evening also honored Mike Wimmer, a celebrated illustrator and artist, with the Arrell Gibson Lifetime Achievement Award in recognition of his lasting contributions to the literary and artistic landscape of Oklahoma.

This year's winners represent a diverse array of voices and genres, from children's literature and poetry to fiction and lifetime achievement.
