Read Across Oklahoma, the beloved preschool and early-grade literacy event, returns to the Oklahoma City Zoo and Botanical Garden on Tuesday, April 9 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. This annual event features Oklahoma-author Kylan Mogg's enchanting children's book *The Forgetful Elephant* along with a variety of interactive learning stations for children of all ages to engage in throughout the Zoo.

The first 1,500 children who visit the Zoo on April 9 with paid admission or a Zoofriends membership pass will be gifted a complimentary book. For the families and classrooms unable to attend the event, a dedicated page on the Department of Libraries website will host a special Read Across Oklahoma video and online activities. Additionally, online participants will have the pleasure of glimpsing Zoo animals and their habitats in the featured video.

Read Across Oklahoma is part of the statewide My First Library program, an early literacy initiative coordinated by the Oklahoma Department of Libraries. During one school year, the program distributes 1,600 books each month to early learning classrooms.

Early literacy lays the groundwork for a lifetime of learning, personal growth, and academic success. "By investing in early literacy initiatives and providing children with access to books and environments such as the Oklahoma City Zoo, we not only foster enrichment and lifelong learning through reading but also play a crucial role in preparing children for school and ensuring their success in academic pursuits," said Ashley Welke, director of services to libraries at the Oklahoma Department of Libraries.

“Read Across Oklahoma is one-of-a-kind celebration that the Zoo is proud to host,” said Candice Rennels, OKC Zoo’s director of public relations. “This is such a unique, positive experience for Oklahoma’s young learners to not only connect with wildlife but also build their skills and interest in reading through engaging activities.”

*The Forgetful Elephant*, authored and illustrated by Kylan Mogg, narrates the tale of a young elephant venturing far from home, encountering an array of animal characters on her quest to rediscover not just her way back, but also her courage. The book is available for purchase online at Amazon and Barnes and Noble.
